BEE BANK REVIEW:-

Sue Sellick and I carried out a review of the Bee Banks progress on Monday 27th July.

We are able to report that:-

- 1) There are clear signs of Bee activity across the Bee Bank and wild flower area
- 2) The previously sown wildflower seeds are now in evidence around the Bee Bank and will only increase in numbers with each season
- 3) The insurgent Perpetual Spinach is being managed by hand weeding
- 4) A number of previously unreported butterfly species have been observed, Common Blue, Clouded Yellow, Gate Keeper, Small Copper have been noted by Sue & myself both of whom carry out butterfly surveys for local nature organisations.
- 5) It is an interesting observation that my neglect of strimming is allowing the previous agricultural grassland (it never was a meadow!!!) to start to evolve into a meadow as originally planned
