The time and place remain the same. The van arrives at the Cricket Pavilion at 10.55 for 20 minutes. There is a new list of future visits on the village notice board.




Shapwick Starlets WI sue Sellick


As the year draws to a close, our year finished with our usual Christmas Party and then the not so usual Carol Singing. Although there were only six of us, we had our own backing music, thanks to

The end of a long and busy term has drawn to a close. This term is often the most tiring for our students, coping with new year groups, routines and changing expectations. Our students have coped remarkably well in school and within the boarding houses where we have offered the support needed to help students adjust. We have managed an induction for a relatively large amount of students who joined new in September across the years from all over the world. It is always amazing to watch how young people adapt and help one another to cope with a new environment - not always plain sailing but to watch friendships form, trust build and self-esteem begin to rise is what the start of the Shapwick journey is about.

Our 6th Form have taken up residence at our old DT Block in the village centre. As post 16, Key Stage 5 students, this relocation seems wholly appropriate and the students are adjusting to 'life up the road'. Still part of school, they enjoy greater independence, more work space and an age appropriate environment. Year 12 have settled positively into college life, learning how to balance work, rest and play.

Our Enrichment programme has continued with a variety of activities. Students have been offered a range of clubs such as; Dance, Gym, Trampolining, Handball, Horse Riding, Skiing, Parkour, Outdoor Learning, Basketball and Rugby.


