
# Talks at the Church

# Is faith credible in a scientific age?

Unfortunately, the media often portrays science and faith as being in conflict, and some groups indeed act in this way. But as a Christian who originally trained as a scientist, I am bound to ask: if God created the universe, why would the scientific study of this same universe be in conflict with faith in God? Over the next couple of months, we'll be looking at this issue.

# **Shapwick Starlets WI**






Our Book Club and Film Clubs are continuing to flourish, our next book being One Pair of Feet by Monica Dickens and next film Philomena.


# Shapwick - Traffic Surveys—Report by SCC Traffic Engineer (carried out in March and April 2018)

# Speed Surveys - March 2018

Somerset Highways deployed traffic survey radar equipment for 9 days in March 2018 on Station Shapwick within the 30mph limit. From the daily reports sent back, an average traffic flow was established. Results were as follows.

Over a 24 hr period, the average traffic flow was 1280 vehicles. 85% of the vehicles were traveling at a speed of 30.1 mph (85<sup>th</sup> percentile) and the mean speeds were calculated at 25.1mph. A visual representation is also shown in the graph opposite.

This would not constitute a speeding problem.




# Vehicle Lengths - April 2018

Following the speed surveys, this was then followed up on the request of the Parish Council a survey to identify the lengths of vehicles travelling through the village. This was deployed again on Station Road within the 30mph limit in April of 2018. Results as follows.

Over a 24 hr period, the average traffic flow was 784 vehicles. Of which 708 were less than 5.2m in length. 33 vehicles were between 5.2m and 6.6m, 33 were between 6.6m and 11.6m and 10 were longer than 11.6m in length. Again this can be shown in the visual graph opposite.

This shows the majority of vehicles through the village are not HGV's.
