#### PARISH COUNCIL REPORT 21st Jan 2020

There was a full turnout of Parish Councillors together with The Clerk for the January meeting with three parishioners and our County Councillor in attendance. The salient points:

- There is a broken culvert under Northbrook Road which is giving rise to flooding, and is already a significant hazard causing at least two cyclists to crash. Without repair the situation can only get worse and the matter is being pursued by the Parish Council.
  - Dog fouling (please see later)
- Some of the village's 'fingerposts' are in need of re-painting and possibly repair. Apparently nobody is permitted to undertake this paint job themselves until they have attended a County Council course.

Other matters were discussed but space prohibits further reporting here. We have been annoyed for some time at the number of HGVs which pass through the village; apparently nothing much can be done about it, but the Parish Council remain optimistic for a solution.

#### **DOG FOULING**

Not only deeply unpleasant, it is dangerous, and whilst rare, contact with dog excrement can cause toxocariasis. Most dog owners are picking up their pet's excrement, however there is an increase in the amount of dog mess around the village.

The law states that being unaware a dog has fouled OR not having a suitable bag is NOT a reasonable excuse and failure to clean up after your dog WILL result in a Fixed Penalty Notice of up to £100. If the case goes to Court this could cost the owner or person in charge of the animal up to £1000. The Parish Council are in discussions with the Sedgemoor Dog Wardens, installing signs to remind residents to 'pick up' and dog waste bins will be in place soon, although we are reminded that any **public** bin can take the bagged waste. **Please pick up**.

#### **VILLAGE LITTER PICK 2nd FEBRUARY**

Eighteen volunteers representing all age groups (100% increase on last year) turned out on a lovely sunny morning to collect litter from hedges, verges, and ditches around the village. The usual collection of cans, bottles and cardboard were picked up, together with a few bags of dog mess which, sadly, some find easier to hurl into the hedge rather than take home. All volunteers were rewarded with bacon rolls and coffee kindly donated by Brian Norris, and a worthwhile time was had by everyone.

# SHAPWICK SCHOOL SIXTH FORM RAISE £827.56 FOR AUSTRALIAN BUSH FIRE RELIEF CHARITIES



ASHCOTT FOOTBALL CLUB was established in 2013. Our club enables Children and Adults from the local community to come together and enjoy playing football, in a fun and safe environment. #### **SHAPWICK NATURE**

Shapwick is at the centre of a Nature Conservation hotbed; we aim to provide regular updates: -

**RSPB HAM WALL**: Regular visitors will be aware work has now begun on the refurbishment of the three viewing screens at the Waltons section of Ham Wall.

It was decided that they would change the designs so that viewing is fully open at the front and screened from behind. The screens will also allow for larger groups and easier access for wheelchair users.

They will be reusing much of the plastic planking and old plastic posts from the previous structures. This plastic surround is then infilled with stone – the idea being to have as little wood as possible at ground level in the wet conditions of Ham Wall. A covered seating area is included in each screen with further screening behind the structure made from timber infilled with reed bundles cut from the reserve.
